



Medicaid Benefits

Medicaid is a joint state-federal program to provide health care to persons who qualify under the program guidelines. In Wisconsin, Medicaid covers a wide variety of medical services, including most services also covered by Medicare.

Persons can be eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid programs. They are also known as “dual-eligible or dual-entities.” For many dual entities, Medicaid is used to cover the premiums, co-insurance and deductibles from the Medicare program, although Medicaid is by law the payer of last resort to nearly all health insurance plans including Medicare.
